Grandparent's Mass & Morning Tea

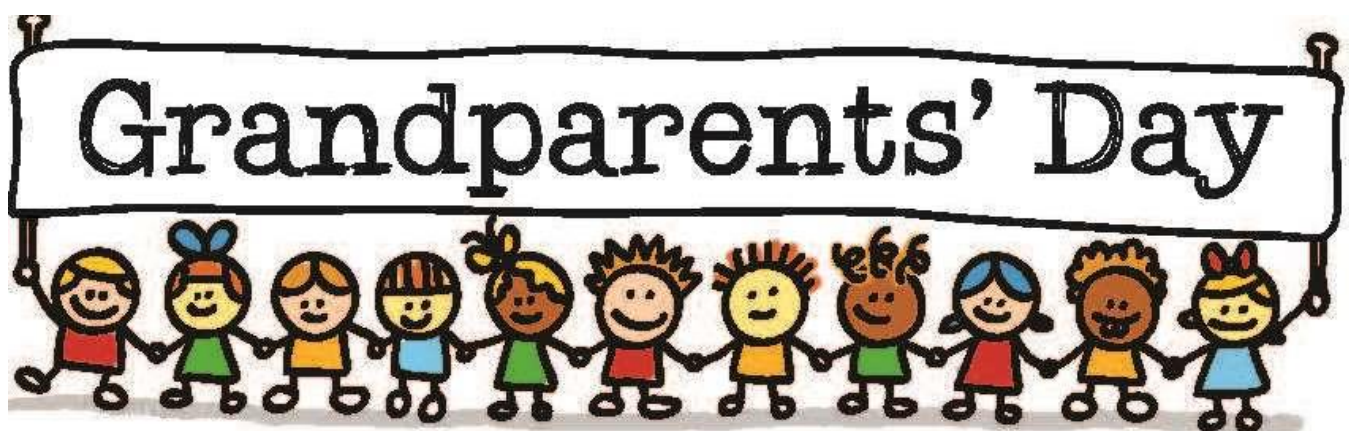

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (the national data collection) is an annual collection that counts the number of school students receiving an adjustment due to disability and the level of adjustment they are receiving to access education on the same basis as other students.

School Fees

May we take this opportunity to thank parents who have paid their school fees by the due dates as it greatly assists our accounting process, and ensures availability of cash flow in order to provide the best educational service to the students of St Joseph's.

We are currently following up families with outstanding accounts. Accounts which remain overdue will be referred to the Catholic Schools Office Fee Liaison Unit.

To assist families keep up to date with payment of school fees, statements are emailed in the first week of each month, and instalment payment dates are:

- Standard: Second payment was due **4 May**, final payment due **27 July**
- Monthly: Payments are due on the 15th of each month, **15 July through to November**
- Fortnightly: Payments due **27 Jul, 10, 24 Aug, 7, 21 Sept, 5, 19 Oct, 2 Nov**
- Weekly: Payments due **27 July, 3, 10, 17, 24, 31 Aug, 7, 14, 21, 28 Sept etc**
